



Global Cyber Center

Located in Chelsea, the Global Cyber Center provides the local industry with curated events and programs and offers co-working space for domestic and international startups, corporate innovation teams, and investors. It also includes a virtual testing environment called a cyber range for simulations.

The Global Cyber Center, run by Israeli corporate innovation company, SOSA, fosters collaboration and innovation across sectors and around the world. The center serves as the go-to location for the cyber industry in NYC and as a landing pad for startups with ambitions to expand to NYC.

Inventors to Founders

The Inventors to Founders program is designed to launch new cybersecurity startups, sourced from university campuses that commercialize IP research. These future founders will receive training, matching with experienced entrepreneurial talent, and access to growth opportunities within the city's cyber ecosystem and beyond, to accelerate innovation and commercialization.

Run by Columbia Technology Ventures, the program will also provide growth opportunities for pre-seed and seed-stage companies based in academia.

Key Outcomes: Recruit and support 14 startup teams each year

Cybersecurity Moonshot Challenge

This civic challenge seeks to deploy new or emerging cyber technologies built for New Yorkers and tested in New York City. In particular, it will focus on surfacing solutions that make every small business as safe and resilient to cybersecurity threats as a Fortune 500 company. The competition enables technologists, entrepreneurs, academics, and industry leaders to design creative solutions to accomplish that ambitious goal. Major international cities will be invited to participate and a \$1 million investment prize will be offered to eligible finalists. The challenge is a collaboration between MOCTO, NYC Cyber Command, and NYCEDC's Cyber NYC.

Key Outcomes: Deploy enterprise-grade cybersecurity solutions for NYC small businesses and boost in job growth at participating cyber companies








Cybersecurity Moonshot Challenge Partners

Applied Learning Initiative

The Applied Learning Initiative is a suite of four educational programs, offered and operated across the major academic institutions in New York City. The initiative provides undergraduate, graduate, and continuing education students with industry-informed learning experiences to prepare them for the job market, and addresses the workforce shortage in cybersecurity.

This initiative is run by a CUNY-led consortium that includes Columbia University, New York University, Cornell Tech, and an online educational platform, iQ4.

Key Outcomes:

Stackable Credentials Program: Enroll 800 students over three years

CUNY-Facebook Master's Program: Graduate up to 300 students over three years

Tech in Residence: Cyber Corps: Engage industry experts teach 50 courses over three years

Virtual Apprenticeship and Internship Courses: Enroll 8,000 students over three years

Cyber Boot Camp

This accelerated training program prepares individuals, especially those from underserved communities, for local jobs in cybersecurity. The boot camp curriculum is designed around industry-specific competencies. A dedicated bridge program offers upskilling and supportive services to select students.

The programs are run by Fullstack Academy, a topranked software development and training company, and LaGuardia Community College, a nationally recognized expert at pioneering innovative learning programs and initiatives committed to diversity, equity, and inclusion.

Key Outcomes: Place more than 1,000 students in jobs over three years
